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
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The section of the WAG Trail owned by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation is now open to all users, incl. snowmobiles. The WAG Trail is a key part of the Triple Divide Trail System, a multi-use trail being developed from Rochester. NY, to Williamsport, PA. Snowmobiles also may use other sections of the corridor (e.g., the Genesee Vallev Greenway, Letchworth State Park, and other connecting parks and trails in NY and PA). The Triple Divide Trail System is itself only one part of the planned Genesee-Susquehanna Greenway, a system of parks and trails stretching 400 miles from Lake Ontario in Rochester, NY, to Chesapeake Bay in Havre de Grace, MD. The Genesee-Susquehanna Greenway will connect nature parks, multi-use trails, and forested riparian (streamside) buffers along the Genesee River (NY and PA), Pine Creek (PA), and Susquehanna River (PA and MD).

The eco-tourism, quality of life, and economic revitalization generated by this greenway infrastructure will provide an incentive to expand forested buffers along these river corridors that will improve wildlife habitat, water quality, and flood mitigation.
